Pastor's Corner







It seems when it comes to the women of the church, no one shows up empty-handed. The women of this synod are amazing at sharing their gifts and talents. This is evident when one attends a church potluck, when a request goes out for donations to the Sunday school, or when a quilt is needed for a raffle or to keep a young child warm after a tragedy. The women of the church show up, in their own way, when a call is made.

Each year at the summer convention, collections are taken. If you have attended a convention, you are familiar with the quilt truck. A large semi-trailer is parked and donations of quilts made all year round are brought to fill the truck. The truck is then driven down to St. Paul to the Lutheran World Relief warehouse where the quilts will then be sent around the world to provide comfort, relief, and love to those who need it most. Each year it gets trickier counting all the donated quilts as women arrive with their arms full of boxes to load up. One church even sent a trailer full of boxes with quilts this past summer to the convention to send down to St. Paul. The quilt truck gets very busy and the fantastic volunteers put many hours into organizing and stacking the boxes, getting them all ready for the trip.

For the 2024 WELCA Convention in Grand Rapids, the in-kind gift will be Lutheran World Relief School Kits. Now is the time for church groups to put out the call for supplies/donations and organize a School Kit assembly party. If your group is interested in making/assembling School Kits to bring as in-kind contributions to the 2024 WELCA Convention next summer, here is the website to check out: https://lwr.org/kits/school-kits/instructions.

As you plan your assembly parties or any other events, please do not forget to include all the ladies of your church from the youngest to the oldest. Providing opportunities for our youngest members of WELCA to participate will go a long way toward their future involvement in the church and this organization. I have a 10-year -old daughter and there is nothing she likes more than helping at church. Give her the task of walking around a table while placing items in a bag that will be sent to someone who needs those supplies and she is happy as a clam. The sense of accomplishment and belonging she has when she is working with ladies of all ages on a task like assembling School Kits is amazing. I would imagine we would want, all young and old, to feel the same.

Memories of a Lifetime Lutheran Eleanor Flathman

Eleanor had a happy childhood, growing up on a Nebraska farm with five siblings and feeling nurtured by home, church and community. Her great grandmother, seeing a need for a church in their rural area, called the Lutheran Bishop and asked him to start a church.

Immanuel Lutheran Church was a result of that conversation. And so began Eleanor's journey as a 'Lifetime Lutheran' and 'Child of God' with her baptism and continued with Sunday and Vacation Bible School, Confirmation, Luther League and Church Organist at Immanuel Lutheran Church.

Memories of Sunday School and Vacation Bible School: Before Sunday School lessons, the children gathered for songs and prayer. Each child received a folder with a story, a picture about the story and a craft idea. To get to Vacation Bible School, Eleanor rode a wagon pulled by horses and sometimes going by horseback.

Memories of Catechism and Confirmation: When eleven years old, Eleanor joined nine other students for Confirmation. Confirmation lasted two years, each day starting at 9am and ending at 3pm. She said it was a joy to see the other students. They studied the Luther's Catechism.

The Friday before Confirmation, the confirmands had to stand at the front of the church and answer guestions the Pastor asked from their Catechism lessons. She received a white carnation, her first flower, and a Bible the Sunday of Confirmation.

After confirmation, Eleanor joined the choir, played the pump organ for Sunday School and Church Services and participated in Luther League. Their Luther League had a newsletter, book reports, games and officers. A favorite memory of Luther League was when a WW2 veteran came and sang Harbor Lights.

As a young rural school teacher, Eleanor recalled seeing a pack of dogs while walking to school. She sang hymns all the way to school and arrived safely.

Eleanor's spiritual life continued as a pastor's wife, a member of Ladies Aide, a quilter, singing in choirs and helping as an interim organist. Eleanor has been a member of ORLC for 35 years, joining with her husband, Pastor Jerry Flathman. Currently she is a member of Joy Circle and a quilter, making rolled cloth bandages to be sent to Lutheran World Vision.

Eleanor has led a busy life, living in nineteen different houses in twelve states, is the mother of eight, a friend to many and a writer of letters. She has a lifetime appreciation of music, nature and her family. Favorite Bible verses are Micah 6:8 and Timothy 4:6-8. Favorite songs are Great Is Thy Faithfulness,

Beauty of the Earth and Children of the Heavenly Father.

At ninety-four, Eleanor Flathman continues her journey as a lifetime Lutheran.

Stir Bisquick, milk, eggs, cheddar cheese and remaining Parmesan cheese until blended.

Pour over turkey.

Bake 30 to35 minutes.
