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



We will be gathering completed foster care kits for kids in the foster care system. Many kids enter the foster care system with whatever personal items they can quickly gather, carried around in a garbage bag. We will not be putting kits together on the 11th – please deliver completed kits only!

The quilt truck will be at the September 11th meeting, from 12 noon to 2:00 p.m. in the South parking lot at Zion Lutheran, Grand Rapids. They will be gathering the foster care kits, Global Health Ministry kits, and Lutheran World Relief kits and quilts. *Quilts and LWR kits must be boxed and labeled, ready to ship, with the mailing label on four sides.*

We look forward to seeing you at Zion Lutheran on September 11th! Save the date for the next year's Summer Convention/Gathering, June 6-8, 2022 at Sugar Lake Lodge.



COUNCIL MEMBER OF THE MONTH

While trying to find some inspiration for my newsletter article, I decided to scan my book shelves. As I was looking through the stacks of books I came across one that has been with me since college: <u>The</u> <u>Purpose Driven Life</u> by Rick Warren. I remember my mom reading this book when I was in high school and then she passed it along to me when I was in college. I have picked it up a few different times but have never made it through the 40 day journey. I decided that now is the time to commit to the 40 days of reading and take this spiritual journey.

In a time of polarizing opinions, social media comparisons and fear based on unknowns this book reminds readers that "it all starts with God." The purpose of life is **not** about you. Warren writes, we "begin at the wrong starting point." We often ask selfcentered questions in order to discover our goals or our purpose. Instead of thinking about what we want or what we think our purpose is or should be we need to understand that we "were made by God and for God." I feel like a lot of people (me included) fall into the trap of doing what we want, doing what others want us to do or doing what we *think* others want us to do. I was reminded in the first day of reading that my life is not my own. God knew me before I was born, he created me his purpose. Instead of trying to please myself and those around me, I need to please God and work each day to be the person he created me to be. This is the message conveyed in Day One. Just think how much more there is to learn, be reminded of or challenged by in the other 39 days!

If you haven't read <u>The Purpose Driven Life</u>, look it up, determine for yourself if this book can energize you, offer you some peace, or help you to gain understanding in your life. If you have read it in the past, pull it back out and commit to another 40 day journey, you may find a new resonating message. Challenge conventional wisdom and find your purpose based on biblical truths!

Beloved of God, I am so excited to welcome you back to a new school year of learning and growing at Our Redeemer Lutheran Church this fall! God's Word is Our Great Heritage

There is much to celebrate as we plan for our **75th anniversary celebration on Sunday, October 17**th! In 1946, Our Redeemer Lutheran Church was founded in Pine City when the Pine Grove and Milburn Lutheran Churches merged and moved to their new location in town.

"God's Word, Our Heritage."

That's the theme of our 75th anniversary celebration coming up this Fall. We will be inviting former pastors to join us for the reception, and our newly elected Bishop, Amy Odgren, will be our guest preacher and presider during worship on Sunday, October 17.

This year, we will be looking back. We will be remembering the stories of the faithful souls from Our Redeemer who paved the way for the ministries we are a part of today.
